Morning: If you want to work in construction, this is for you! Learn about erosion and sediment control on construction sites. Construction companies must have at least one employee that has the *trained contractor* certification on site every day that soil disturbance activities are taking place. Participate in both morning and afternoon programs to learn how to manage stormwater on a construction site, and you will get an official *trained contractor* wallet card.



Afternoon: Learn how green stormwater practices manage water, including rain gardens, green roofs, bioretention areas, permeable paving and pavers.
